### Kenzie's Story:

At six months old, Kenzie's parents noticed she was not reaching typical milestones. They worked with doctors, specialists, and physical therapists and underwent genetic testing, looking for answers. But before they had a clear picture, Kenzie had a seizure that lasted for more than forty-five minutes. An ambulance transported Kenzie to The Barbara Bush Children's Hospital (BBCH), where doctors and nurses were able to stop her seizure. Kenzie was later diagnosed with epilepsy and an ultra-rare genetic disorder of the VPS13D gene.

Now at nine years old, Kenzie's frequent stays at BBCH are caused primarily by seizures and feeding tube issues. She is admitted often through the Pediatric Emergency Department, a place that has become all too familiar and comfortable to this resilient young lady.

Despite the unknown future and the challenges that come with Kenzie's genetic disorder, her family maintains an incredibly positive outlook. Her father, Kevin, shares, "In all these instances, the level of care at BBCH is bar none. Not only do they take such wonderful care of Kenzie and her needs, but they also make sure the whole family is cared for. BBCH is like a big family, and we couldn't imagine entrusting anyone else to care for our daughter in an emergency. State-of-the-art, compassionate care, right here in our backyard."
