## Maine Medical Center Maine Transplant Program Policy and Procedure Required Personnel and Training

**Purpose:** To outline Maine Transplant Program's commitment and approach to a strong and expert multidisciplinary team.

**Policy:** In accordance with both UNOS and CMS requirements, the Maine Transplant Program will hire and support a qualified and diverse multidisciplinary team including physicians, nurses, social workers, Financial Coordinators, Specialty Pharmacist, nutritionist, medical assistants, and administrative support.

## Procedure:

- 1. The Maine Transplant Program will adhere to all CMS and UNOS Policies on required (CMS) and Transplant Program Key Personnel (UNOS).
- 2. Required and Key Personnel include: Primary Surgeon and Physician, Clinical Transplant Coordinator, Clinical Transplant Pharmacist, Financial Coordinator, Transplant Social Worker, Transplant Nutritionist, and Medical Expert Support such as Anesthesia, Infectious Disease, Pathology, and Histocompatibility.
- 3. Key Personnel changes will be communicated to both UNOS and CMS as required by UNOS Bylaws and CMS Standards.
- 4. Transplant Program Personnel will at minimum, meet Maine Health requirements for their job title and meet job requirements and standards outlined.
- 5. Clinical Transplant Coordinators, Clinical Transplant Pharmacist, Financial Coordinator, and Transplant Nutritionist, and Transplant Social Worker will attend regular training specific sessions to maintain competency; 16 hours per year will be considered the minimum requirement for full time team members.
- 6. The Living Donor Advocate will remain organizationally aligned with the Department of Ethics. S/he will participate in training sessions in both Transplant and Clinical Ethics, and will be assessed for competency on an annual basis.
- 7. All Transplant team members will receive a complete and comprehensive orientation to their role as well as a general orientation to MaineHealth.
- 8. Clinical Transplant Coordinators will be encouraged to pursue Certification through the NATCO following two years of experience in the role.
- 9. All Transplant team members will undergo an annual performance and competency evaluation, and be expected to adhere to MaineHealth values, including a commitment to diversity and inclusion, at all times.
