Basics and Beyond Major Depressive Disorder

BASICS

- Major depressive disorder or clinical depression is a common and serious mood disorder, and can often affect the health and wellness of the patient, including their compliance to a treatment plan.
- Minor depression applies when people have at least 2 symptoms of depression, but less than 5. **Major depression applies** when there are at least 5 symptoms of depression that last for at least two weeks.
- Prevention and utilization of screening tools, such as the Patient Health Questionnaire (PHQ) can help to identify opportunities and improve outcomes. Click <u>here</u> for more information.

Use ALL applicable codes to accurately document a patient's condition, more than 1 can be documented Remember to M.E.A.T. (Monitor, Evaluate, Assess and/or Treat) and document:

- Type of disorder (depressive, manic or bipolar)
- Severity (mild, moderate, severe)
- Episode (single, recurrent)
- Status, if in remission, avoid use of "history of" and consider "in remission"
- Presence or absence of symptoms of depression
- Treatment (eg. Follow up visits, referrals, pharmacology)
- Document additional depression classifications, if applicable
- If psychotic features, document and assign appropriate codes, as listed above

BEYOND THE BASICS ICD10 CODING CONSIDERATIONS

REMISSION

 Avoid using "history of" and consider "in remission" and use one of the following codes based on occurrence:

Partial	Symptoms of the previous major depressive episode are present, but full criteria are not met, or there is a period lasting <2	F _{32.4} (Single episode)
	months without any significant symptoms of a major depressive episode	F _{33.41} (Recurrent)
Full	No significant signs or symptoms	F32.5 (Single episode)
	of major depressive disorder present during the last 2 months	F _{33.42} (Recurrent)

OTHER BEHAVIORAL DISORDERS

 Be sure to document episode, severity, type or other contributing factors

COMORBIDITIES

 Or medical conditions that exist at the same time as diagnosis or later develop in conjunction with Major Depressive Disorder. Common conditions include:

SUBSTANCE USE, ABUSE AND DEPDENDENCE

- Abuse and dependence are not interchangeable and are separate conditions, eg. Use and abuse or abuse and dependence
- There are no history codes for substance abuse, code "in remission"
- Be sure to code with complications, if applicable (eg. Induced psychotic disorders, hallucinations, delirium)

F10.X	Alcohol Related Disorders (assign alcohol blood level, if known)
F11.X	Opioid Related Disorders
F14.X	Cocaine Related Disorders
F17.X	Nicotine Dependence

ICD10 CODING SCENARIOS

Example	ICD 10 Coding
AWV for 70 yo female, PHQ score of 5 and multiple symptoms of depressive state. Also, current cigarette smoker, and current diagnosis of HTN.	•I10, Essential (Primary) HTN AND •F32.0, Major Depressive Disorder, single episode, mild AND •F17.210, Nicotine Dependence, Cigarettes
21 year old follow up for depression. PHQ score of 3, provider noted patient recurrent and in partial remission.	•F33.41, Major Depressive Disorder, recurrent in partial remission
Patient visit for depressed feelings and check up on bipolar disorder, reports being non-compliant with antipsychotic medication.	•F31.9, Bipolar Disorder AND •T43.506A Under dosing of unspecified antipsychotics and neuroleptics, initial encounter AND •Z91.128, Patients intentional under dosing of medication regimen for other reason.
